This train the trainer programme aims to give new insights to educators and pre-service educators about different approaches to implement coding and computational thinking in the learning process. Educators and pre-service educators who would like to acquaint themselves how Artificial Intelligence can be implemented across the curriculum, create digital stories using Scratch, understand how Virtual Reality and computational thinking nurture digital competences and how Micro:bits can enhance the teaching and learning process are invited to apply for this programme. During these training sessions the Code.org Computer Science Fundamentals curriculum will also be discussed. Educators who will participate in EU Code Week Malta Educators' Programme 2022 will also be encouraged to become multipliers of the EU Code Week campaign in their schools.
